Rector Search Update

On Monday evening, Rev. Suzanne Roberts, Transition and Deployment Officer for the Diocese of Maine, met with vestry members who will serve as the search committee. There are two models currently available for us as we look for a new rector. Because Fr. Tom is willing to be available to train a newly ordained priest, we can pursue what is called the coadjutor model. In consultation with the bishop and newly ordained priests, we would be presented with candidates.

Fr. Tom will be completing his work in mid April, and he would overlap with the new priest during the new year once a selection has been made.


If the first model doesn't work, the second model opens the search wider and will take a longer time. It will require more work in terms of creating a church profile, offering a benefit package and advertising through the national church. We will most likely need an interim priest during this process. The consensus is that we would do some of the work that this model requires, which would inform the co-adjutor search, but would prepare us if the candidates available do not work out for us.

Thora Easton will chair the committee. Other members include: Anita Chandler, Allison Schroth, Bob Simmons, Chris Hickey, Kathleen McCormick, Lenita Richard, Lorna Blackmer, Kathleen McCormick, Steve Koskinen, Tom Ainsworth, and Wayne Franklin.

A Prayer for Those We Love

Almighty God, we entrust all who are dear to us to your neverfailing care and love, for this life and the life to come, knowing that you are doing for them better things than we can desire or pray for, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

NOTES ON THIS SUNDAY'S MUSIC

Composed in 1846 for the Birmingham Festival in England, Mendelssohn's oratorio *Elijah* reflects both his own creative genius and his admiration for the great choral works of Bach and Handel. The aria "Then Shall the Righteous Shine Forth" is sung close to the end of the oratorio, immediately following a chorus describing Elijah's ascent to heaven in the midst of a whirlwind, borne upward by a chariot of fire.

Written in 1747, "Love Divine, All Loves Excelling" is not only one of Charles Wesley's most famous hymns, but also one of his most popular. It is a Christianization of John Dryden's secular song, "Fairest Isle" sung by Venus in Act 5 of Dryden and Henry Purcell'ssemi-opera *King Arthur*. However, in Dryden's song, the goddess of love chooses the Isle of Britain over her native Cyprus; in Wesley's hymn, divine love itself is asked to choose the human heart as its residence over its native heaven.

"Thy Kingdom Come, O Lord" is based on the 2nd petition of the Lord's Prayer. The author, Frederick Hosmer, an eloquent advocate of world peace, served both Unitarian and Congregational churches in five states, and was regularly invited to present lectures on hymnody at Harvard Divinity School.

Known as "the father of the Negro spiritual," Harry T. Burleigh (b. 1866) served for over 50 years as the celebrated baritone soloist of St. George's Episcopal Church, New York City. A prominent teacher, composer, editor and arranger, he had a legion of admirers, from the financier J. Pierpont Morgan to the composer Antonin Dvorak, who credited Burleigh with inspiring his famous "New World Symphony." Over 2,000 mourners of all faiths attended his funeral at St. George's Church in 1949, and his birthdate, September 11, is honored with a feast day in the Episcopal Church calendar.

For a number of years Director of Music at Manhattan's Church of St. Thomas More, composer Harvey Burgett (1943-2022) taught at Stetson University, Rollins College and Boston University, and received commissions from a number of performers and institutions including the Episcopal Diocese of New York. His spiritually evocative setting

of *The King of Love Is My Shepherd* was composed in 1996. A man of diverse talents, Harvey Burgett was an avid synchronized swimmer and won a gold medal at the 2017 World Masters Swimming Championships in Budapest, Hungary.

Our recessional hymn, "Tell Out, My Soul", was written by Timothy Dudley-Smith (1926 –)--a now- retired Anglican bishop- in 1962. In the early days this hymn was paired to another, rather dry tune, but it was later paired and greatly enhanced by the sweeping music of Walter Greatorex's (1877 – 1949) grand tune, "Woodlands." The tune's title refers to one of the schoolhouses at Gresham's School, Norfolk, where Greatorex was director of music and taught such luminaries as Benjamin Britten and W.H. Auden. Auden wrote of him that Albert Schweitzer played the organ no better than Walter Greatorex.

Michael McCabe (b.1941) combined a full-time military career with an active schedule as both organist and composer. Highly regarded as a performer, he served for a time as organist of Grace Cathedral, San Francisco. The "Fanfare" heard this morning is hot off the press: it was published just this past November.~HT
